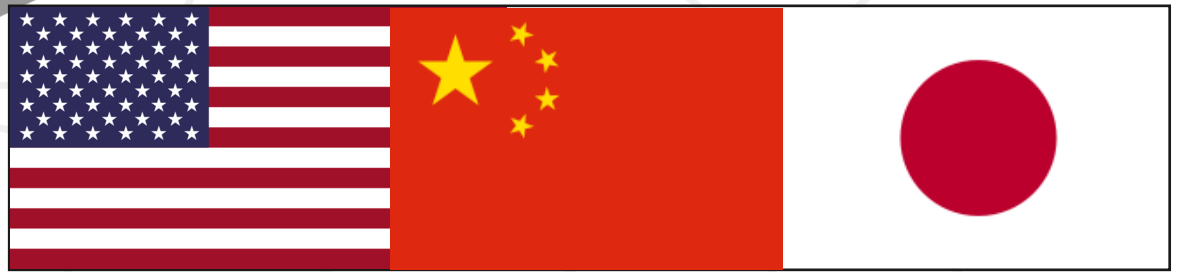

Douglas Paal is vice president for studies at Carnegie Endowment for International Peace. He previously served as an unofficial U.S. representative to Taiwan as director of the American Institute in Taiwan.
